PREMISE

The space defined as "Dealers' Den" is an area that is chosen and identified as such, for each event organized by A.P.S. Furizon. The area is managed by the relative manager (from now on *Team Leader*) who will take care of the application of the rules contained in this document. The area is generally assigned for carrying out activities related to artistic promotion, in any form, and crafts compatible with the purposes of the events promoted by the Association.

The term "Main Staff" will refer to the main coordination body of the Association.

Article 1 – ADMISSION AS AN EXHIBITOR

All artists, dealers and artisans (now referred to as Dealers) regularly registered for the event organized by the Association, which will host the exhibition space, can participate in the Dealers' Den . All people who access with the "Daily Ticket" formula are excluded.

Only Dealers who have as their object of their exhibition content themed with the event, with the *furry* subculture and with the purposes promoted by the Association will be admitted to the Dealers' Den. A fundamental requirement is also the submission of the application made within the deadlines provided for by the specific event.

The presence of a Dealer at the exhibition space presupposes the full acceptance of this document.

Article 2 – ALLOCATION OF EXHIBITION SPACES

Before the opening of the event, the Dealers' Den Staff will contact the interested artists so that the participations in the exhibition space can be collected. Participations can also be collected through forms on the event website. The requests will then be discussed with the Main Staff to logistically organize the exhibition space.

The number of places available will be decided before the opening of the registrations and will be assigned on a first-come, first-served basis and, possibly, according to instructions received from the Main Staff.

The assignment of a seat will be free of charge. The organizational staff will take care of providing, for each station, access to the electricity grid. Only devices that have a consumption considered "normal", which does not weigh excessively on the system (chargers, table lamps, etc ...). Any requests for different supplies must be communicated to the Main Staff of the Association for their possible evaluation and approval.

Each Dealer is allowed to use one and only one workstation, subject to agreements made with the Main Staff.

Article 3 – ACCESS TO EXHIBITION SPACES

Access to the Dealers' Den is allowed in accordance with the times and methods provided by the Main Staff of the Association, based on direct agreements made with the management bodies of the places where the events take place.

Access to the Dealers' Den will be granted to Dealers in advance, at least sixty minutes before the opening of the exhibition area, in order to be able to prepare their own workstation and prepare all the necessary material.

The Team Leader, assisted by his volunteers, will arrange everything necessary so that the activities related to the Dealers' Den are correctly promoted and managed both throughout the preparation phase for the event, and during the event itself, being able to compare the Team Leaders of other groups.

Article 4 – PERMITTED MATERIAL

Dealers are authorized to exhibit all the material necessary to promote their artistic activities, whether in the form of a drawing (paper and/or digital portfolio) of *crafting* (fursuit, accessories or handicrafts) or other type provided that it is eligible for this regulation.

The exposed material must comply with the regulations relating to the safety and well-being of the person as well as being respectful of the aims and social objectives of the Association.

Article 5 – OBLIGATIONS AND LIMITATIONS

In compliance with the previous article, it is forbidden to exhibit material considered *not safe for work* (hereinafter called *NSFW*) or more commonly defined as "for adults", remaining authorized the exhibition of material containing artistic nude scenes. The organizational staff may at any time request the removal of any material or object, falling within the definition of *NSFW*, exposed by the Dealers. Any waiver must be agreed in advance between the Team Leader of the Dealers' Den Group and the Main Staff of the Association.

The following will also be prohibited:

- the exhibition and promotion of material using fur of animal origin, with the exception of synthetic fur and leather material;
- the display of material depicting scenes of violence or any other form of content considered unsuitable for the environment in which the exhibition takes place;
- the display of weapons and dangerous objects;
- the display of material falling within the scope of the "*fetish gear*";
- the exhibition of material that is conflicting to Italian law.

Inside the exhibition space it is forbidden to take filming or photographs that are not those necessary for the documentation of what happens during the event or the material production necessary for the promotion of social activities.

All Dealers are required to behave in a manner respectful of all other participants and in line with the regulations and terms of service of the A.P.S. Furizon Association, accepted during registration for the event.

In the Dealers' Den area, it is allowed to start Live Streams in order to promote their work and activities even outside the event. Internet access will not be made available. Each Dealer must independently manage and reproduce graphic material that requires connection to the network.

Article 6 – EXCLUSION OF LIABILITY

The area dedicated to Dealers' Den is not guarded.

The staff of A.P.S. Furizon will not be held responsible for damage to the exposed material. Each Dealer must take care of their assigned space, not leaving it unattended except at their own risk. Any object deposited, displayed or present in the areas of the Dealers' Den, can not be supervised and any loss or theft will not fall within the responsibility of the Association.
