RULES OF PUBLIC DECENCY – GUIDELINES ON CLOTHING RELATED TO FETISHES

INTRODUCTION

This appendix is intended as a guideline and is not exhaustive.

In the event of a dispute over a specific item of clothing or accessory, A.P.S. Furizon Staff may still request its removal if deemed inappropriate.

Exceptions to what is reported in this document may be granted by the administrators, on an exceptional basis, for example in conjunction with specific theme nights.

The rules of public decency also apply in general to fursuiters, except for explicitly stated exceptions. Should a fursuiter wear clothing or an accessory that is inappropriate or deemed inappropriate, it will still be asked to be removed or replaced.

This appendix applies only to the public areas of the location where activities organized or managed by Furizon staff are taking place.

PERMANENTLY PROHIBITED ITEMS

The following items of clothing and accessories are forbidden in any context.

- a. Full-body costumes made of rubber, latex or vinyl;
- b. Costumes commonly called "*anatomically correct*", intended to explicitly represent the genital organs in any form;
- c. Costumes and accessories related to age-play, pet-play and BDSM practices;
- d. Costumes that highlight the private parts;
- e. Choke collars;
- f. Leashes (both in and without swimsuit);
- g. Electric shock devices, whether or not visible;
- h. Other objects or items of clothing that do not fall under the previous points but are still attributable to fetish and/or eroticism in general.

ALLOWED ITEMS

The following items of clothing and accessories are permitted only if they are used as fashion items or if they are combined with a costume in a consistent manner and within the limits of public decency:

- a) Collars without a leash;
- b) Decorative bracelets, without metal rings;
- c) *Dog Harnesses* (**only combined with a costume**).
- d) Muzzles (**only combined with a swimsuit but without a leash**).

SHOES, SLIPPERS, FLIP-FLOPS, SOCKS AND FIVEFINGERS

Slippers and flip-flops: for safety and hygiene reasons, it is not allowed to walk around the venue in socks, slippers and flip-flops in any public area of the event except for the SPA if present.

Fivefingers type shoes, i.e. those shoes that have the sole with toes are allowed, but not socks.



PRACTICAL EXAMPLES AND GUIDELINES FOR PERMITTED OBJECTS

COLLARS

Generally, most collars are allowed, made of any material, as long as they are used as fashion accessories and not as a representation of a fetish.

Studded collars are also allowed, as long as they are not related to the BDSM world or that they can be risky and become a source of danger.

"Unlimited" collars, i.e. made only of metal meshes, or choke collars of any kind are strictly prohibited. Electric or electro-shock collars are also prohibited.

Collar rings are generally accepted, including the D-Ring, as long as it is not related to any sexual fetish. Collars with more than one ring are to be considered forbidden and can be traced back to fetish. In case of grey area, contact the CdS or Main Staff.

Leashes should never be attached to collars in public areas.

DECORATIVE BRACELETS

In general, all fashion bracelets are allowed. Restrictions may apply to metal rings or studs. In general, all bracelets that have functional rings to block the limbs, typical of BDSM clothing, are also prohibited. Studded wristbands are permitted, as long as they do not pose a risk of injury to other participants. This is to minimize the risk of causing accidental injury to other participants.

HARNESSES

Harnesses are allowed when worn over a costume, respecting the canons of public decency. The breed of the fursona, of course, is not important.

~~Harnesses that wrap around the face of the costume are accepted as long as they are within the canons of public decency and do not give the impression that they are connected to a particular fetish, at the discretion of the security or Furizon staff.~~

Fetish-harnesses (made of leather or sprinkled with studs and rings) are not allowed under any circumstances. Using leashes attached to harnesses is not allowed.

Full-length harnesses are only allowed if they do not prominent the genitals.

GUIDELINES FOR OTHER CLOTHING CATEGORIES

LATEX, VINYL OR RUBBER COVERALLS

Full-face suits made of rubber, latex, vinyl or similar, with or without the possibility of inflating, are not allowed in all public areas of the event.

Partial costumes of the types listed above that meet the requirements of public decency may be submitted to Security for prior approval.

Zentai and the like are allowed only if the face is uncovered and can be traced back to furry fandom. Kigu and Kigurumi are allowed, preferably in a furry fandom-oriented cosplay.

MASKS

Face masks made of leather, rubber or plastic are generally not allowed, except for fursuit heads.

Any mark (of leather or rubber) attributable to a fetish makes the mask unwearable.

Hockey masks or masks related to some movie or TV series (e.g. "V for Vendetta" or "Scream") or non-furry fandom are not allowed in public places. The only exceptions can be granted on theme nights.

Animal masks (horses, dragons, unicorns, etc.) made of latex or rubber material may be allowed, depending on the context and the general outfit. Participants who wish to wear such masks are invited to discuss this with the Staff in advance.

AGE-PLAY

Objects related to age-play practice are not allowed in public places.

Diapers, pacifiers, bottles, onesies, bibs and any other object intended for use by children are strictly prohibited.

Age-play badges are allowed, but the following requirements must be met:

- Any drawn diapers must be cleaned;
- The character must appear as a child (i.e. no adults wearing diapers);
- The character must not be in lewd poses or naked;
- Avoid adult characters and child characters in the same badge;
- The maximum print size allowed is A6.

Any accessories worn **must be well hidden** and must not constitute hygiene, out of respect for other participants.

It is not necessary to inform the Furizon staff if you wear diapers for medical reasons, as long as you comply with the rules described above.

PET-PLAY

Objects related to pet-play are not allowed in public places.

Puppy masks (of any type and material), knee pads, padded gloves, leashes, harnesses without swimsuits and any other object directly related to this practice cannot be worn in public areas.

Any exceptions may be granted by the directors only on the occasion of certain theme evenings.
